Motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to change the salary of police chief from \$1551.18/mo. to \$1597.72/mo., the salary of street and water commissioner from \$1313.25/mo. to \$1352.65/mo., the salary of finance officer from \$705.00/mo. to \$726.15/mo., and the salary of the librarian from \$4.96/hr. to \$5.11/hr., and

Alderman Reister arrived at 7:55 P.M.

Ordinance #139 regulating the hours in which liquor can be sold was discussed. Changes will be made on the ordinance and the new ordinance will have it's first reading next month.

Council discussed drainage problems south of town. Mayor Brodeen will check into some options to resolve the problems.

The 1% sales tax increase was discussed. Auditor Haenfler will do some checking on how much the increase will generate for the City. The money will be earmarked for streets and building improvements.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Oster to renew membership with South Dakota Wastewater and Water Association. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Reister to send Police Chief Luke to Community Policing Consortium in Rapid City. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Oster to allow Finance Officer Haenfler to attend an Annual Report Workshop. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Reister and seconded by VanGerpen to send of Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich to Yankton to a Pesticide Recertification Course. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by VanGerpen and seconded by Reister to renew Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich's Operator Certification at the cost of \$6.00. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion was made by Oster and seconded by Einrem to adjourn at 8:22 P.M. All voted "aye'. Motion carried.
