The regular meeting of the Avon City Council was held on the above date at the Avon Public Library at 7:30 p.m. Roll Call: Mayor Frey, Finance Officer Haenfler, and Alderman: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, Knoll, and Deurmier. Also present were Police Chief Luke, Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich, Tom Alberts, Orval Elliott, J.H. Krcil, Agnes Krcil, Louise Koopman, Alice Biesma, Jack Brodeen, Don Sattler, Lyle Mensch, Ludd Bertsch, and Terry Schultz.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Frey.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Oster to approve the agenda with the addition of Don Sattler. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Knoll and seconded by Reister to approve the minutes of the December 1, 1997 meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

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Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister to accept the receipts as presented. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Oster to declare the Community Bank of Avon, SD the official depository for the coming year. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Oster to declare the Avon Clarion, a newspaper published and printed in Avon, SD, to be the official newspaper for the coming year for publications of City proceedings and notices. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Finance Officer Haenfler informed the Council that information on recycling bins was being mailed to the City. Recycling will be discussed at the February meeting.

Motion by Reister and seconded by VanGerpen to declare the following items surplus:

18 - 9' posts
51 - 8' posts
1 - 16' 10" culvert
1 - 24' 12" culvert
2 rolls of 6' woven wire
21 rolls of 4' woven wire
2 - 10.00 - 20 truck tires & rims
2 storm windows 26 x 57 good shape

All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Mayor Frey set up a committee of Alderman Knoll, Alderman VanGerpen, and Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich to get appraisal on the items declared surplus and to present the appraisals at the next meeting in February.

Mayor Frey informed the Council that the Methodist Church is ready to be received by the Avon Historical Society. The Deadwood Historical Society Grant that was applied for is still waiting for notification of approval. Council will look at the church before making decision at accept.

Mayor Frey passed around to the Council a survey petition done by J.H.Krcil that canvassed residents on Pine, Birch, and Maple Street about curb and gutter. The majority of the residence were in favor of curb and gutter. A discussion was held about making curb and gutter mandatory and giving residence the option of paying in full or paying over a designated period of time as a special assessment. The City will look into what options are available for financing the curb and gutter.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Einrem to draw up a mandatory curb and gutter ordinance. Roll Call: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Eirnem, Knoll, and Deurmier all voted "aye". Motion carried. None voted "naye".

A special meeting will be called to hold the 1st reading of the curb and gutter ordinance. Mayor Frey suggested that the Council give extra consideration to Pine Street as a priority street to mat do to the extra efforts of the people on that street.

City is in need of gravel. Schultz is having gravel crushed. The City will have Schultz crush 6000 tons of gravel for a year.

Don Sattler introduced a plat on behalf of Lyle Mensch and Randy Sullivan. Sattler respectfully requests the Councils acceptance of an additional 125' on 1st Avenue as a city street. Sattler congratulated the Council on a job well done on the streets on the west side of town. He thanked the Council for tearing down the baseball fence, painting the water tower and pool.

Motion by Resiter and seconded by VanGerpen to accept the additional 125' on 1st Avenue as city street. Fill dirt and gravel will be put on that section. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Tom Oster handed out information on the new development project to the Council. The cost to the city for putting water and sewer in and a gravel street was estimated at \$32,350.00. Oster would pay an estimated amount of \$37,750.00 for the project. The land would be split into fifteen lots with a house already existing on one lot, leaving fourteen lots available for building houses. A discussion was held. Terry Schultz added several valuable comments to the discussion and was supportive of the project.

Alderman Deurmier intorduced the following resolution and moved it's adoption: (see attached)

Motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was seconded by VanGerph. Roll Call: Reister, VanGerph, Einrem, Knoll and Deurmier all voted "aye". Alderman Oster abstained. None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Police Chief Luke discussed with the Council the present snowmobile ordinance.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by VanGerpen to change the present ordinance hours prohibiting the operation of snowmobiles within the City from 6:30 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. to 1:00A.M. and 6:00 A.M. The first reading of the amended ordinance will be read at the February meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

The following schedule of wages were presented by Mayor Frey:

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to change the salary of police chief from \$1650.00/mo. to \$1700.00/mo., the salary of street and water commissioner from \$1500/mo. to \$1560/mo., the salary of finance officer from \$775/mo. to \$800/mo., the salary of librarian from \$5.25/hr to \$5.50/hr, the salary of street labor from \$5.25/hr to \$5.50/hr, the salary of dump site from \$5.15/hr to \$5.50/hr, with all other salaries to remain the same. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by VanGerpen and seconded by Reister to donate \$300.00 to Green Thumb. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Oster and seconded by VanGerpen to allow Finance Officer Haenfler to attend an Annual Report Workshop in Sioux Falls on January 29, 1998. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Knoll and seconded by Reister to send Street and Water Commissioner Motion a Pesticide Applicator School in Yankton on January 26, 1998. All voted "aye".

Motion carried.

Alderman Reister informed that Council thatin the next year or two the City will need to consider purchasing a different ambulance. The present one is starting to need a lot of repairs.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion was made by Einrem and seconded by VanGerpen to adjourn at 10:40 P.M. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
