Mayor Frey reaffirmed to the council that Carol Berndt started working for the city December 22, 2000 in a training mode, and that she is officially appointed as Finance Officer. A motion by Dertein and seconded by Reister to approve the appointment of Carol Berndt as City Finance Officer. Roll Call vote: Kuhlman, Tjeerdsma, Reister, Den Ouden, Tolsma, and Dertein all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Police Chief Roland Luke arrived at 7:20 to present the monthly police report. It was decided the report could be given personally or submitted in writing.

Concerns were shared with officer Luke regarding the speed and vehicles on 1st Avenue. The police department will monitor the situation and report to the Council next month.

Mayor Frey informed the council of the resignation of Mary Borin from the Library Board. Mary has served on the Community Library Board for some 40 years. The Mayor and Council expressed their regards and appreciation for Mary's commitment and service to the community. A replacement member is being sought.

Committee reports: **Buildings, Park, Land** Mayor Frey thought the best idea would be to have the library move into the building first and then decide if there is sufficient room for offices and or a meeting room. Alderman Tjeerdsma presented a floor plan for the BJ's building containing the library, one office, a meeting room area and a unisex handicap restroom. Motion by Tolsma and seconded by Den Ouden to go ahead with the insulation and turbines on the building. All voted "aye". Estimates will be gathered and applications for grants will be filed.

Streets and Alleys a target date of the April meeting was set for the street plan for the year 2001.

Sewer and Water no report.

Health and Pool there was a discussion on the plan for the pool. No action taken at this time.

Nuisance and Dump no report

Finance and Purchasing no report

Other business Finance Officer Berndt requested mileage and meals for a one day workshop in Sioux Falls regarding Annual Reports on the 25th of January. Motion by Den Ouden and seconded by Reister to allow Berndt to attend workshop. All Voted "aye". Motion carried.

A motion was made by Dertein and seconded by Reister to go into executive session to discuss personnel matters and wages. All voted "aye". Motion carried. The Council went in to executive session. Finance Officer Berndt left at 8:30. Alderman Reister left after about fifteen minutes, he did not return.

The council came out of executive session 45 minutes later. A motion was made by Tolsma and seconded by Tjeerdsma to approve the following wage and personnel matters:

A) Roland Luke, police chief, will become a part time employee effective January 1, 2001 working between 20 and 25 hours per week. Pay rate is to be \$10.50 per hour. City will pay him a \$200 per month health insurance allowance and he will obtain his own health insurance. City will continue to contribute to Luke's S. Dak. retirement based on hours worked. He will receive 40 hours of

personal leave (includes vacation, sick leave, bereavement, jury, etc.) and 5 holidays annually. He will retain the title of police chief.

B) Allen Kocmich, commissioner of water and streets, will receive \$9.85 per hour effective January 1, 2001.

- C) Carol Berndt, newly appointed finance officer, will receive \$8.00 per hour for time worked. It is expected she will work up to 30 hours per week. She will receive no employee benefits at this time. Berndt's performance will be reviewed in six months, and, if her performance is satisfactory, she may be eligible for a wage adjustment.
- D) Lloyd Hieb, street/water labor, will receive \$8.00 per hour effective January 1, 2001, and is expected to work twenty plus hours per week as a part time employee. He receives no employee benefits.
- E) JoEllen Wormsbecher, librarian, will receive \$7.00 per hour effective January 1, 2001, and is expected to work 21 hours per week as a part time employee. She may be required to work additional hours when and if the library is moved form its current location to another building. She receives no employee benefits.
- F) All employees will be paid by the hour effective January 1, 2001. (Excludes mayor and council.)
- G) All other salaries and wages remain the same for the calendar year 2000.

All council members voted "aye" on the motion regarding personnel and wage matters. The motion carried.

Summer program wages and personnel for swimming, baseball, softball, etc. were discussed. It was decided to ask the Park and Recreation Board to review the council's suggestions and make recommendations to the council at a later date.

Motion by Kuhlman and seconded by Den Ouden to adjourn at 9:30 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
