Mayor Frey gives Ordinance #269 entitled "2001 Annual Appropriation Ordinance" it's second reading. Motion by Den Ouden and seconded by Reister to approve the second reading of Ordinance #269 as read. Roll Call: Kuhlman, Tjeerdsma, Reister, Den Ouden, and Dertien all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried. Absent Alderman Tolsma.

Mayor Comments: Mayor Frey informed the Council that he would send a letter to the County Highway Dept. stating that the City is not willing at this time to accept maintenance of 2nd Ave.

Paperwork has been received from SD Community Fund to apply for a grant to help with costs on the new library building. Mayor Frey and Haenfler will complete the paperwok.
