Dave Brandt was concerned about people making U-turns in the middle of Main Street. The council was aware of this and had alerted Police Chief Luke of this matter. Dave also spoke to the council about the weeds behind the old Rancho Cafe and Jurren's Electronics. Dave was warned by the health inspector that something needs to be done about the weeds. Dave mowed the weeds and billed the city accordingly. The Council decided to pay the bill and bill out to the people responsible for controlling the weeds.

Gasohol bids were to be opened, but after a long discussion it was decided that the bidding process was understood by all the bidders. Motion by Brodeen and seconded by Knoll to reject all bids and accept North Vue Quick Stop's bid from last month for 5.5¢ discount off of pump price. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

As advertised, a public hearing to renew liquor licenses was held at this time. Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister to approve the application of Kenneth Thompson, dba Kenny's Bar, located at Lot E_2^1 16, Block 3, Original Townsite, Avon, SD for Package (off-sale) Liquor and Retail (on-sale) Liquor License. Roll call vote: Brodeen, Reister, Einrem, VanGerpen, and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Motion by Knoll and seconded by Reister to approve the apllication of Jim Martin, dba Martin's Bar, located on Lot 14, Block 3, Original Townsite, Avon, SD for Package (off-sale) Liquor and Retail (on-sale) Liquor License. Roll call vote: Brodeen, Reister, Einrem, VanGerpen, and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Brodeen to approve the application of Michael Carr, dba Dutch's Corner, located on Lot 9, Block 6, Milwaukee 1st, Avon, SD for Retail 9on-sale) Liquor License. Roll call vote: Brodeen, Einrem, Reister, VanGerpen, and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Mayor Bryan gives Ordinance #248 entitled "Supplemental Appropriation Oridnance of the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, for the year ending December 31, 1995" its first reading. Motion by Brodeen and seconded by Reister to approve the first reading of Ordinance #248 as read. Roll call vote: Brodeen, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Harlan Quincer from Schmucker, Paul & Nohr Associates and Pam Side from District III discussed extensively with the council the different options the council could take to continue on with the storm sewer/sanitation sewer project. After a very long discussion and questions being answered no decision was made by the council at this time.

The Mayor and Council reviewed the canvass of the returns of the special election on the question of adopting Ordinance #246 entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance #234 and Establishing Water and Sewer Rates and Providing the Procedure for Discontinuance of Water Service for Nonpayment of Water and Sewer Rates and for Nonpayment of Municipal Garbage Collection Fee" held on November 7, 1995. The votes cast and counted showed the following as the result:

Motion by Knoll and seconded by VanGerpen that the foregoing tabulation of the question of adopting Ordinance No. 246 be approved and that the adoption of Ordinance No. 246 is hereby declared defeated. Roll Call vote: Brodeen, Einrem, Reister, VanGerpen and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Knoll to close the City Dump November 25, for the winter months and to open the dump on January 6, 1996 for anyone wanting to dispose of their Christmas Tree. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Brodeen and seconded by Reister to add Emil Cahoy, who is under the Green Thumb Program, to the city's workmen's comp insurance. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Alderman Einrem informed the council that all city employees that have a CDL as of January 1, 1996 are subject to random drug and alcohol testing and the city can join a consortuim, which will reducing the testing probability. Motion by Einrem and seconded by Brodeen to join AdMed, Ltd. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Brodeen and seconded by Reister to put a handicap sign in fromt of Chester Betz's home on Main Street. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion was made by Einrem and seconded by Brodeen to adjourn at 9:35 P.M. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
