Motion carried. Absent Alderman Oster.

Alderman Einrem informed the Council that the bars would like to stay open on New Year's Eve until 1:00 A.M.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Reister to allow all bars to stay open on New Year's Eve until 1:00 A.M. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

A brief discussion was held on the street plan. It will be discussed further at the January meeting.

Recycling was discussed. Finance Officer Haenfler will check into cost of a trailer and bins and report back at the January meeting.

Police Chief Luke discussed with the Council the hour wage of the relief cop.

Do to having two city police officers the last 2 years there has not been an increase in the hourly rate for the relief cop. Police Chief Luke asked the Council to consider increasing the hourly rate.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Knoll to increase the relief cop hourly rate from \$6.70 an hour to \$7.10 an hour. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Einrem to charge \$5.00 for 1000 gallons of well water. Deurmir, Einrem, Knoll, and Reister voted "aye". VanGerpen voted "naye". Motion carried.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to officially close the dump after Saturday, December 6. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to adjourn at 8:38 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Proposed Amendment to the Joint Cooperative Agreement October 29, 1997

Present Language

ARTICLE IV, SECTION I. Officers

The officers of the Committee shall be:

- a Chairman;
- Vice-Chairman;
- Secretary; and
- Treasurer.

The above mentioned officers will be elected for two-year terms, with eligibility for reelection for a second term, but may not be elected for more than three terms of office without leaving office for at least one term. Any vacancy occurring in any office shall be filled by the Committee for the unexpired term. The Committee shall also elect for one-year terms three (3) additional Committee members to serve on the District III Executive Board.

Amended Language:

The Committee shall also elect for one-year terms, additional Committee Members to fill At-Large positions on the Executive Board. The Committee shall establish the number of at-large positions by a majority vote of the Committee. A minimum of two and maximum of five at-large positions shall be part of the Executive Board.

A minimum of one position on the Executive Board shall be filled by a minority representative.

Changes Explained: The word "three" was eliminated as the number of atlarge positions. The Committee was given the flexibility to determine the number of at-large positions, within a specified range (between two and five). Finally, a "seat" on the Executive Board was reserved for minority representation.

Present Language

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 6. Duties of Officers—Executive Board

The Executive Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and three (3) At-large Committee members.

It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to oversee, review, and implement decisions pertaining to the management of the District III office and staff.

The Executive Board shall approve all District staff reassignments from one job classifications to another and staff promotions in grade as provided for in the District III Personnel Manual.

The Executive Board shall advise and counsel the District Director on District III policy, financing, and personnel matters. However, any decisions or recommendations made by the Executive Board which would have an impact on any unit of local government served by District III must be approved by the District III Committee.

Amended Language:

The Executive Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and between two and five At-large Committee members.

Changes Explained: The word "three" was eliminated as the number of At-Large Committee members on the Executive Board. The range of At-Large members was inserted (i.e. between two and five.)
