TO: Members of Southern Missouri Recycling & Waste Management District:

I am writing to you in regards to the State of South Dakota's Petition for Writ of Certiorari to the United States Supreme Court appealing Judge Piersol's June 1995 decision that the original boundary lines of the 1858 Yankton Sioux Indian Reservation are still intact.

The Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals recently affirmed Judge Piersol's decision and the State of South Dakota still feels very strongly that the 1892 agreement with the Yankton Sioux disestablished the original reservation. That is why the State is appealing to the Supreme Court.

In discussing this matter with the SD Attorney General's office it was suggested that the Southern Missouri District, the owner of the Subtitle D landfill near Lake Andes, file an amicus brief supporting South Dakota's position on the jurisdiction and regulation over the landfill and the lands in southern Charles Mix County. I have spoken with Jack Soulek and Glennis Stern of the Executive Committee and they feel it is a very good idea to file the amicus brief showing this support. I believe that it is important for the Supreme Court to know that the jurisdiction and regulatory issues caused by the current confusion generated by Judge Piersol's decision is important to more than just the people that live within the old Yankton Resevation boundaries. I think that by the District and all its members signing on an amicus brief that the message will be conveyed.

An amicus brief is a "friend of the Court" brief that advises the Court why the amicus party supports the side of one of the litigants. The litigants in the appeal to the Supreme Court action are the Yankton Sioux Tribe and the State of South Dakota.

I ask each member municipality and county of the District to adopt the enclosed resolution at your February meeting and return a copy to me. There will be no cost to your city or county as the brief will be drafted on behalf of the District.

Should you have any questions please do not he sitate to contact me. I am sorry for the short notice but it was just within the last couple of days that this matter came up and there are only a few weeks left to prepare the amicus brief. That is why time is critical on this matter.
