Motion by Reister and seconded by Oster to advertise for rental of the concession stands at the parks and pool. Bids to be opened at the March meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Knoll to pay the Weepees as a separate team. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Mayor Brodeen gave Ordinance #249 entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance No. 139 and Regulating the Hours in Which Liquor Can Be Sold" its first reading. Motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to approve the first reading of Ordinance #249 as read. Roll call vote: Einrem, Reister, Oster, and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Absent Alderman Van Gerpen. Motion carried.

The second penny additional sales tax was then discussed. Mayor Brodeen had some figure on about how much the second penny sales tax would generate in revenue. The first penny brings in about \$45,000. It is estimated that the second penny would bring in about 70% of that. The seconded penny will be used for streets and equipment. The first reading of the additional penny sales tax ordinance will be

read at the March meeting.

Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich discussed with the council the streets. After a long discussion it was decided to schedule Oak Street from 3rd to 4th Street, and partial piece going east on 4th Street, Popular from 2nd to 3rd Street, and Pine a $\frac{1}{2}$ a block this year.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Knoll to declare the following items surplus:

The City Grader is shot and needs to be replaced. Auditor Haenfler will look in to whether the City can get a grader through emergency or if need to bid.

Mayor Brodeen, on behalf of Rick Thompson, requested a dance permit for September 21, 1996. Mayor Brodeen introduced the following resolution:

RESOLUTION PERMITTING USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

WHEREAS, SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorizes and permits the governing body of the City of avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, to grant prior authorization for persons to consume or blend alcoholic beverages upon certain property which is owned by the public or a non-profit corporation within the jurisdiction of the governing municipality and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of and for the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, has duly considered the request of Rick Thompson for permission in accordance with the above said statue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that in accordance with SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorization is hereby given to Rick Thompson for the use of the Avon American Legion Hall and to mix or blend and consume alcoholic beverages upon

and within the aforesaid premises on the 21st day of September, 1996 between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 1:00a.m.

The lights at the softball field are coming off the poles, which is dangerous. Motion by Oster and seconded by Reister to take lights down because they are a maintanence problem and hazard. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Other things discussed, the north wall on the bath house at the pool needs to be tuck-pointed. Canopies in the park need to be re-roofed. Sidewalks that are not being cleaned after a snow fall.
