Nominating petitions are to be filed by March 14, 1997. Alderman Oster introduced the following resolution and moved it's adoption:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is necessary to hold an annual election for the election of certain municipal officers, it $\hat{s}i$ therefore

RESOLVED THAT WHEREAS, pursant to the laws of the State of South Dakota, an annual election for the election of Municipal Officers is required to be held on the second Tuesday of April each year, the City Finance Officer be, and she is hereby authorized and directed and required to give notice of such election by publication being not less than ten days prior to such election, and the officers to be voted for thereat.

That the polling place for all Wards shall be at the Avon Fire Hall of Avon, South Dakota in accordance with Ordinance of Record, and the polls at such election shall be open continuesly from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. of said day, that the City Finance Officer be authorized and directed to prepare official ballots for said election.

The following persons by and they are hereby appointed Municipal Election Clerks: Lois Simek and Myra Klock, and the Election Judge shall be Reta Ridgway.

At this time Alderman Oster discussed with the Council the city getting a computer to do financial books on. Brad Poppe is willing to set up accounting system on the computer for the city. Prices will be checked into.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Oster to set the dates for the Board of Equalization meetings for March 17 at 7:00 p.m. and March 20 at 6:30 p.m. Meetings to be held at the City Library. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

The City Personnel Manual was discussed in a lengthy discussion. Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Einrem to table the matter at this time.

Motion by Oster and seconded by VanGerpen to join the National Flood Program which will allow city residence to purchase flood insurance and to put Finance Officer Haenfler in charge of assisting with this matter.

Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich informed the Council that the sewer line from Don Janssen's corner to Dave Brandt's is broke and needs to be fixed. Estimated length is 9 to 10 feet. Kocmich will contact Halsey to take a look at it.

The cost to replace the tractor was discussed. The price for new was from \$26,000 and up. The Council asked Kocmich to get a figure on what it would cost to fix the tractor and bring to the March 17 meeting.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to advertised for bids to mat 6 blocks of city streets and bids to be opened at the April 7, 1997 meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Weeds in the city pasture where discussed. It was decided to aerial spray the pasture next fall.

The Council decided to have Schultz haul gravel in for the city and stock pile around 2000 tons.

Motion by Oster and seconded by VanGerpen to declare the following items surplus:
