Mayor Brodeen gave Ordinance #249 entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance No. 139 and Regulating the Hours in Which Liquor Can Be Sold" it's second reading. Motion by Oster and seconded by Reister to approve the second reading of Ordinance #249 as read. Roll call vote: Oster, Reister, Van Gerpen, Einrem and Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Knoll to set the dates for the Board of Equalization meeting for March 18 at 7:00 p.m. and March 20 at 8:00 p.m. Meetings to be held at the City Library. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Commissioner Kocmich and Dennis Deurmier spoke to the Council about Walnut

A building code ordinance is going to be looked into. Mike Petrik would like the road going to his house to be graveled. Kocmich is looking into whether it is actually a road or not. Legion Hall needs a new roof. Council decided to see if they still need money after their fundraiser.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Reister to send Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich to a workshop in Brookings, April 10-11 for Stabilization Pond and to pay for his expenses upon his immediate return. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Delinquent water bills were discussed. The Council agreed to follow the Public Utilities Commissioners guidelines. A written notice will be sent. If payment is not received in 20 days, a verbal warning will be given, and 10 days after the verbal warning if payment has not been made the water will be shut off.

Alderman Knoll brought to the attention of the Council that the police car is usking oil and that the Council needs to start thinking about a new or different police car.

The Avon Dump will open on March 16, weather permitting. It will only be open on Saturdays until sometime in April.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time, a motion by Einrem and seconded by Van Gerpen to adjourn at 9:35 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
