INSURANCE

Dennis Deurmier spoke to the Council about sewer being put in by his residence where he intends to build housing. The following resolution was introduced by Brodeen, seconded by Koehn:

WHEREAS, there is a possibility of new building construction taking place in undeveloped area (area with no building and no access to sewer and water) of Avon; and,

WHEREAS, water and sewer will be needed in undeveloped area in order to accommodate building expansion; and,

WHEREAS, the city cannot afford to run water and sewer to any and all undeveloped areas of the city without any assurance of a return on water and sewer rates; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that anyone requesting new sewer and water to any undeveloped areas be asked to share the expense of the new untilities on a 60-40 ratio if the structure is not partially completed in one years time.

The following resolution was introduced by Einrem, seconded by Brodeen:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the property east of the alley on the block between Pine Street and the south one-half of the block between 1st Street and Railway it has been sold as a part of a unit to Cliff Buchholz; and,

WHEREAS, the city will retain access to maintain the sewer line after installation; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Railway Street east of said alley and Birch Street south of Deurmier's driveway be abandoned as city streets and after a sewer line is installed south on Birch Street past Railway at that this street property revert to the unit now owned by the Buchholz family.

The Council discussed the poor condition of the bleachers at both ball fields. A motion was made by Einrem, seconded by Knoll that the city purchase a set of bleachers for the ball field. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

\$500,000

Mayor's comments: The city will receive \$5,000 in grant money for the water and sewer project. There will be a demonstration of pump to clean lagoons in Wall, might be something to attend. It was brought to the attention of the councilman that Street Commissioner Allen Kocmich needs to take a course in Stabilization Pond.

Motion by Koehn, seconded by Brodeen to send Street Commssioner Allen Kocmich to a workshop in Brookings for Stabilization Pond and to pay for his expenses upon his immediate return. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Brodeen brought to the Councils attention that the school had approached him about the school water bill. No action was taken.

Reister discuss with the Council that Lora Tolsma has taken her EMT classes and never submitted a bill for the class to the city. She is now in need of a hepatitis shot. He suggested the city pay for her shot.

Motion by Knoll, seconded by Einrem to pay for Lora Tolsma to receive a hepatitis shot. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time, a motion by Einrem and seconded by Brodeen to adjourn at 9:20 PM. All voted "aye". Motion carried
