Motion by Reister and seconded by Den Ouden to accept the foregoing receipts.

All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Discussion was held on one day liquor license sales on Sunday, July 2 during the Centennial. Some of the Councils comments were that no one had approached them that was opposed to the sale of alcohol on Sunday, July 2nd during the Centennial. Comments from the community were that the bars have pop, water, gartorade, bathrooms, and air conditioning. No one is making anyone drink alcoholic beverages. The bars also have food services. Comments opposed to the sale of alcohol on Sunday, July 2nd during the Centennial were, do we have to drink to celebrate and what kind of message are we showing the kids. Several other comments were heard.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Einrem to have the City Attorney draw up an ordinance to allow sale of alcohol on Sunday, July 2nd during the Centennial for all businesses with an alcohol license during the time of 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight. The first reading of the ordinance to be held at a special meeting before the regular June Council meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Discussion was held on allowing sale of malt beverages on Sunday year round. Ken & Vicki Swatek requested that the Council consider allowing both on and off sale malt beverage on Sunday so that A1 does not have to close down the video lottery machines on Sunday. Suggestion from the community was to have the community vote on the issue and decide what they want. Alderman Kuhlman arrived at 7:30 p.m. Other comment was what would be the difference allowing people to purchase package malt beverage an drink it at home verses drinking it on the premises. Choice is the issue here. No is making anyone play video lottery or drink. It is a personal choice. The Council and community was informed that what was being requested was to allow on and off sale of malt beverage on Sunday which will allow all businesses that hold an alcohol license to be open on Sunday year round and sell on and off sale malt beverage.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister to have the City Attorney to draw up an ordinance allowing all businesses that hold an alcohol license to be able to sell on and off sale malt beverage on Sunday year round. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Alderman Fathke had some items he would like to discuss before adjourning.

Motion by Fathke and seconded by Reister to allow Alderman Fathke to discuss additional items before adjourning. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Fathke and seconded by Dertien to rescind part of the motion on April 3, 2000 meeting that stated 1 block of Railway Street from Maple to Pine Street and to motion to mat just the portion of Railway Street from the waterway west of Pine Street to the alley. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Discussion was held on whether an engineer had been hired. No engineer has been hired at that time. Alderman Fathke explained some of the project to the Council, that Gerald Hayward needed some dirt in driveway, the centennial committee discussed the ball park fence and would like the City to do the whole highway side with fence. Alderman Fathke informed the Council that he authorized Jarvis Winckler to get ball field ready and suggested that the Council approve the roofs on the ball field. Winckler informed the Council uniforms are needed and the estimated cost for the Teener uniforms would be about \$56 per uniform. Some equipment was found that the team can use. Balls, helmets and bats are needed. Legion uniforms were found and are in good condition if some is willing to coach the Legion. Discussion was held about putting agrilime the field. Several people have expressed donating their time and trucks to get the agri-lime.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Kuhlman to table the baseball field discussion for the new council. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Alderman Fathke discussed the clinic door should have a bar put on in. Kocmich informed the Council that there is a anti-theft plate that could work. Luke stated if they want in bad enough they will figure out a way to get in. Fathke also suggested that the City paint the shop. Discussion was held on sand sealing. Two companies suggested that sand seal was not the way to go, chip seal would be better. Price to sand seal would be .47 (forty seven cents) per square yard and chip seal would be .57 (fifty seven cents) per square yard. The City could piggy back off of City of Wagner's chip seal bid.

Motion by Fathke and seconded by Kuhlman to piggy back off the City of Wagner's bid from Top-kote to chip seal all of the streets that are matted 3 years or older. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Fathke and seconded by Den Ouden to get price quotes to paint the City Shop. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Fathke to adjourn at 8:00 p.m. and to immediately reconvene as the newly elected City Council and to re-organize said Council for the coming year. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
