Mayor Frey calls the new City Council meeting to order.

Auditor Haenfler administers the Oath of Office to James Frey, as Mayor for a term of two years and declares him duly installed as the Mayor of the City of Avon. As advertised, the Public Hearing for a One Day Liquor License for Avon Alumni was held. Motion by Deurmeir and seconded by Reister to approve the one day license. Roll call vote: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, Knoll, Deurmier, all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

As advertised, a Public Hearing for the renewal of Malt Beverage License for Dutch's Corner was held. Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister to approve the application of Michael Carr, dba Dutch's Corner, located on Lot 9, Block 6, Milwaukee 1st, Avon, SD for a package (off-sale) Malt Beverage License. Roll Call vote: Oster, Reister, Van Gerpen, Einrem, Knoll, and Deurmier all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

As advertised, a Public Hearing for the renewal of Malt Beverage License for North Vue Cafe & Quick Stop was held. Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Einrem to approve the application of Ray Voigt, dba North Vue Cafe & Quick Stop, located on Lot 14, Block 11 Schroeder 2nd, Avon, SD for a package (off-sale_Malt Beverage License. Roll Call vote: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, Knoll and Deurmier all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Wayne Tjeerdsma addressed the council about Spruce St. being in need of gravel. The council asked Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich to check the situation.

Jack Dier and Jack Williams on behalf of the county meet with the council to discuss sharing of equipment. The county is willing to cooperate and help the city when possible. County's preference if city would rent a piece of equipment, that a county employee operate the equipment. The city is also will to help the county out if the need ever arises.

Auditor Haenfler gives Ordinance #251 entitled "SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF AVON, BONHOMME COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1996" it's first reading. Motion by Reister and seconded by Deurmier to approve the first reading of Ordinance #251 as read. Roll Call vote: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, Knoll, and Deurmier all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Mayor Frey appoints Roland Luke as Police Chief, Allen Kocmich as Street and Water Commssioner, and Peg Haenfler as City Finance Officer all for a one year term. Motion by Oster and seconded by Knoll to approve said appointments at the wage schedule approved in January. All voted "aye". Motion carried. Mayor Frey then swears in the Police Chief, Street and Water Commissioner and Finance Officer and declares them duly installed.

Streets were discussed. It was decided to mat all streets 26 ft. wide. If residents choose to put in curb and gutter, it will be placed so that back of curb to back of curb is 30 ft. The council decided that the city would put in the radius on every corner as the streets are paved. A special meeting will be held to further discuss streets and to set up a public meeting for the community.

Mayor Frey informed the council of a request for gravel in the alley behind Randy Myers. Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich is to blade and work the alley, and report back to the Council on condition of the alley.

Auditor Haenfler on behalf of the Avon Alumni, requested a dance permit for May 31, 1996. Alderman Einrem introduced the following resolution and moved it's adoption;

RESOLUTION PERMITTING USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

WHEREAS, SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorizes and permits the governing body of the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, to grant prior authorization for person to consume or blend alcohlic beverages upon certain property which is owned by the public or a non-profit corporation within the jurisdiction of the governing municipality and,

WHEREAS, The City Council of and for the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, has duly considerd the request of the Avon Alumni for permission in accordance with the above said statue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that in accordance with SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorization is hereby given to the Avon Alumni for the use of the Avon Legion Hall and to mix or blend and consume alcoholic beverage upon and within the aforesaid premises on teh 31st day of May, 1996 between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 1:00 A.M. Passed and approved this 6th day of May, 1996.

Motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was seconded by Reister. Roll call vote: Oster, Reister, VanGerpen, Einrem, Knoll and Deurmier all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried.

Street and Water Commissioner Kocmich informed the council that there were some water main valves in need of replacement. Kocmich is to get estimates of cost and present it to the council. Kocmich asked if the council wants to paint the City Shop. Council wants estimate on cost before a decision is made. The council requested that Kocmich check with Lloyd Hieb and Fred Voigt in sharing the duties of the dump.

Mayor Frey ask if the pump for the pool was in and ready to go. Kocmich informed them that the electrical work was complete but the plumbing was not done. Kocmich has been in contact with Elliott's Plumbing several times to get the work done.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister that Mayor Frey should contact Elliott's Plumbing and give them 7 days to complete the work or the council will hire someone from out of town. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to appoint Mayor Frey as the city's representative for the Southern Missouri Waste Management Association. All voted "aye". Alderman Oster will be the alternate.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to send Finance Officer Haenfler to Finance Officer School in Pierre, June 12-14. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Alderman Oster presented to the council the idea of renting out the pasture ound the lagoon for sheep to be pastured. Kocmich will check if this is allowed.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion by Einrem and seconded by Deurmier to adjourn at 9:40 P.M. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
