

AVON, SOUTH DAKOTA – June 10, 2002

A special meeting of the Avon City Council was held on the above date at the Avon Public Library at 7:00 p.m. Roll Call: Mayor Bechtold, Aldermen: Kuhlman, Tolsma, Tjeerdsma, Reister, Cameron, and Finance Officer Berndt. Also present Roger Frey, Allen Kocmich and Terry Schultz. Absent: Aldermen Mensch.

Mayor Bechtold called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Bechtold gave Ordinance No. 274 entitled “An Ordinance Authorizing Sale of all Alcoholic Beverages on Sunday” first reading. Motion by Tolsma and seconded by Tjeerdsma to approve the Ordinance No. 274 as read. Roll call: Tolsma, Kuhlman, Cameron, Reister and Tjeerdsma voted “aye”. Motion carried.

A discussion was held regarding the grant possibilities for Railway Street through the DOT. An engineer will be contacted and the grant application will be completed.

Goodwill Industry asked for permission to park a trailer in town on a rotation schedule every 8-10 weeks, this would begin in July. The city would need to provide a lot or area to park, and would also be ask that the trailer be opened in the morning and shut at night. The Council felt that the Legion lot would be a good place.

Bids for front tires on the blue truck were opened. The three tire dealers in town all entered bids, and the low bid of \$396.00 was received from D & L Oil. Motion by Kuhlman and seconded by Cameron to accept the bid and award the work to D & L Oil. All voted “aye”. Motion carried.

It was reported by Mayor Bechtold that the Swim Team has been awarded \$1,000.00 from Wal-Mart. The money reportedly will be used to purchase new suits.

Allen Kocmich gave a report on water leakage. This was a study done by Don Pospshil of Yankton. The report had several suggestions and these will be addressed in a timely manner.

It was decided to contact Heartland Tank of Crooks, SD to see if they would be willing to inspect the city water tower and prepare an estimate for the cost of repairs.

Motion by Tolsma and seconded by Reister to prepare the bids for work on Elm street and let the bids after the July meeting. All voted “aye”. Motion carried.

Having no other business, motion by Kuhlman and seconded by Cameron to adjourn at 8:40 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned.
