Police Chief Luke addressed the Council about a complaint about a vehicle parked on a street. He has talked to owner. Luke also, discussed the Fast Cops Grant with the Council. The city is waiting for the approval on the grant before a cop is hired.

Mayor Bryan appointed Roland Luke as Civil Defense Director and Dave Brandt as Assistant Civil Defense Director, effective immediately.

Council discussed having some rock crushed and stock piled in Jack Wynia's pit. The cost would be \$2.25 a yard. Mayor Bryan will contact Jack to find out more details.

Motion by Brodeen, seconded by Einrem to have Randy Schoenfish audit the '93-'94 city books. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion was made by Knoll, seconded by Erodeen to go with Blue Cross for health insurance. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Brodeen, seconded by Knoll to Pay Haenfler a \$225.00 wage for the Treasurer's job and place her on the insurance and retirement.

All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Applications for dump site manager were discussed. One application was received from Fobert Wiebenga. Motion by Brodeen, seconded by Reister to hire Robert Wiebenga for the dump. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Mayor Bryan informed the Council that the metal frames for the bleachers are here and the aluminum is coming soon.

Brodeen was contact by Lewis & Clark Mental Health Center that the center is working with a family from Avon that can not afford a family swimming ticket and swimming lessons. The center would like the city to see if there is a way that this family could do some type of work or service for the community to pay for these items. Brodeen will check in to this matter.

It was discussed that the contract for the sewer project will not be signed until the grant money is awarded. At the time that the grant money is awarded a special meeting will be held.

Council discussed a change in the way swimming lesson money was collected and handled. It was decided to leave it the same as last season with Pelton receiving and hourly wage for swimming lessons.

A rescue tube is need for the swimming pool do to state regulations.



Kocmich will see that one is ordered. A request for an umbrella for the lifeguard chair was made. Kocmich is to check out prices on umbrellas.

Deb & Nyla's Beauty Shop have requested that the parking places by the beauty shop be placed back into parking places. It was decided that Kocmich would see to it that the lines are painted for the parking places.

Reister informed the Council that the baseball team is in need of t-shirts, bats, and a scorebook. Motion by Brodeen, seconded by Knoll to allow Randy Reister to purchase some t-shirts, a couple bats, and a scorebook. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to be brought before the Council at this time, a motion by Einrem, seconded by Brodeen to adjourn at 9:25 P.M. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
