Sharon Bertsch on behalf of the Historical Society informed the Council that the Historical Society was awarded a grant for \$2256.00 for frames and matting pictures. The money has to be spent, then receipts are turn in to the state for reimbursement. The Historical Society is requesting the City gives them the money to spend and the State will reimburse the City.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Deurmeir to give the Historical Society a check for \$2000.00 for matting pictures and frames. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Another grant was received by the Historical Society for \$1974.00 to hire a professional to identify historical buildings. This grant works the same way as the other grant.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Reister to give the Historical Society the money for professional surveyor on the approval of Tom Alberts of the legal aspects. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Doug Kafka arrived at 8:00 P.M.

Doug Kafka was interested in finding out if the ordinance for the bars to stay open til 1:00 A.M. on Friday & Saturday would be in affect by the date of the street dance. Finance Office Haenfler informed Kafka that it would be in affect before the date of the street dance.

Mayor Frey informed the Council that the water tower project will be held off until the fall do to having to close the pool if work would have continued at the present time.

Mayor Frey discussed with the Council the enforcing of the truck route ordinance. Council felt letters should be sent to all business informing them that the trucks are not allowed on the streets that are not designated as the truck route unless their making a delivery to a house on that street. Law enforcement will be notified to enforce the truck route ordinance.

Finance Officer Haenfler gave Ordinance #254 entitled 'An Ordinance amending Ordinance #249 and Regulating the Hours in which Liquor can be Sold" it's second reading. Motion by Reister and seconded by VanGerpen to approve the seconding reading of Ordinance #254 as read. Roll Call: Reister, VanGerpen, Deurmier, Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Absent Alderman Oster and Einrem. Motion carried.

Finance Officer Haenfler gave Ordinance #255 entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Sale of All Alcoholic Beverages on Sunday Except that the Sale of Off-Sale Malt Beverages is Permitted by Those Businesses that do not have On-Sale Licenses" it's first reading. Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Reister to approve the first reading of Ordinance #255 as read. Roll Call: Deurmier, Reister, VanGerpen, Knoll all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Absent Alderman Oster and Einrem. Motion carried.

Finance Officer on behalf of Connie Reiff, requested a dance permit for July 19, 1997. Alderman VanGerpen introduced the following resolution and moved it's adoption:

RESOLUTION PERMITTING USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

WHEREAS, SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorizes and permits the governing body of the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, to grant prior authorization for persons to consume or blend alcoholic beverages upon certain property which is owned by the public or a non-profit corporation within the jurisdiction of the governing municipality and,

WHEREAS, The City Council of and for the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, has duly considered the request of Connie Reiff for permission in accordance with the above said statue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that in accordance with SDCL 35-1-5.3, as amended, authorization is hereby given to Connie Reiff for the use of the Avon Legion Hall and to mix or blend and consume alcoholic beverage upon and within the aforesaid premises on the 19th day of July, 1997 between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 1:00 A.M.
