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Motion by Einrem and seconded by Reister to accept the foregoing receipts. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

The proposed budget for 1999 was presented by Finance Officer Haenfler. Motion by Reister and seconded by Oster to set the budget hearing for September 9, 1998 and to change the regular meeting date for the same night due to the Labor Day Holiday. Meeting to be at 7:30 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Brad Poppe discuss with the Council the possibility of putting the lights back up on the softball field. Many of the teams in the baseball league are going to starting the games at 5:00 p.m. Alderman VanGerpen will check into the condition of the lights and poles.

Mayor VanGerpen received some information on grants for streets. Mayor VanGerpen will check in to the grant further to see if the city could benefit from the grant.

Alderman Oster presented the Council with a petition from the people living in the block on 1st Ave between Ash St. and Walnut St. All the people on the block will put in curb & gutter and would like the block tore up this year and matted next year.

Motion by Reister and seconded by Deurmier to add this block to street plan for this year and mat next year. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

The Council held a lengthy discussion about the streets and how things would be handled if all the people on the block did not put in curb & gutter. Alderman Einrem will go around to the people living on the blocks to be tore up this year and explain the reason for curb & gutter and the cost.

Terry Schultz arrived at 8:20 p.m.

Alderman Einrem informed the Council that Glen Peterson would like to use the bleachers for the bull riding rodeo he is hosting during the opening of the new bridge. Peterson will haul the bleachers and pay any damages. Finance Officer Haenfler will check out the liability and inform Alderman Einrem. If the city is not liable it is OK with the Council for Peterson to use the bleachers.

Reister left at 8:30 p.m.

Motion by VanGerpen and seconded by Einrem to mat the 150 ft of 1st Ave. from Evergreen to the County road when Evergreen is on the plan, with the agreement that curb & gutter will be put in on both sides. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Terry Schultz discussed with the Council that the radiuses should be squared because it works better when matting the streets.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Deurmier to have all radiuses from this point on be square and the cost for the radius will be \$350.00 and the waterways will be \$200.00. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Terry Schultz is hauling some asphalt for the phone company that is working in town. Schultz would get a full truck load if the City would like some to patch by the school where the work is being done and east of the Manor.

Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to have Schultz get asphalt for the City to patch by the school and east of the Manor. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Alderman Einrem introduced the following resolution and moved its' adoption.

RESOLUTION PROVDING FOR TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM CONTINGENCY FUND AND FROM MAYOR AND COUNCIL TO LIBRARY

BE IT RESOLVED that the moneys in the Contingency Fund established to supplement the General Budget, be transferred to the following funds in the General Fund of the City of Avon, Bon Homme County, South Dakota, to supplement those accounts necessary to conduct the indispensable function of government of the City of Avon: Park & Recreation-Repairs & Maintenance \$3,000.00, Supplies \$3,000.00 and

WHEREAS, the City of Avon, South Dakota, needs to transfer funds from the Mayor & Council to Library Repairs in the amount of \$200.00 to supplement the account necessary to conduct the indispensable function of government of the City of Avon.

Finance Officer Haenfler gives Ordinance #261 entitled "An Ordinance Relating to Street Traffic, Signs and Regulating the Use of the Streets" it's first reading. Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to approve the first reading of Ordinance #261 as read. Roll Call: Oster, VanGerpen, Einrem and Deurmier all voted "aye". None voted "naye". Motion carried. Absent Alderman Reister.

The Council discussed the appointment of a new alderman to fill the vacant seat in Ward I. There were a few names discussed of people that had informed someone on the Council that they were interested. President of the Council, Alderman Einrem will handle the matter.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by VanGerpen to allow NWPS to put in street lights on Evergreen Street. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

Motion by Deurmier and seconded by Oster to have any new street poles and any poles replaced be replaced with steel poles if possible. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

An estimate was received from NWPS to put in the flashing lights on the school corner by parking lot. The cost of each pole was \$1891.02 and two poles would be needed. The Council tabled this matter at this time.

Don Mudder has been hired as the new police officer.

Ap family is interested in purchasing some land of the City's north of the dump to build a house on. Finance Officer Haenfler will contact them and ask them to come to next month's Council meeting.

There are also people interested in purchasing the City property east of the softball field.

Motion by Einrem and seconded by Oster to declare the property east of the softball field surplus. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

The appraisal of the surplus property was presented as follows:

ambulance - \$10,000.00

Motion by Oster and seconded by Einrem to sell the surplus item on sealed bids to be opened at the September 9, 1998 meeting. All voted "aye". Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion was made by Einrem and seconded by VanGerpen to adjourn at 10:15 p.m. All voted "aye". Motion carried.
