SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE NO 353

Be it ordained by the City Council of City of Avon, South Dakota that Ordinance No. 350 The Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Ordinance be supplemented as outlined below:

Section 1:

Whereas there was a failure to provide by the annual appropriation ordinance for 2023 a sufficient appropriation to enable the City of Avon, South Dakota to conduct the indispensable functions of government relating to the operation and maintenance of the expenditure of the General, Library, & Water budgets.

NOW THEREFORE, the following sums are hereby appropriated for the continued operation and maintenance of the designated funds and departments:

GENERAL FUND:

Mayor/Council \$12,000.00; Finance Office \$10,000.00; Sanitation \$9,000.00; Recreation \$5,000.00; Pool \$40,000.00; Parks \$1000.00, Library \$16,000.00

WATER FUND: \$43,000.00

SEWER FUND: \$13,000.00

Section 2:

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed. Appropriated funds shall be paid from surplus in the General Fund, Water & Sewer Funds

Section 3:

Should any section or sections of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional by a court or last resort, the same shall not invalidate the remaining sections of this ordinance.
